- Women empowerment programs are conducted for girl students.
- Concept catalogue is done for easy and quick search of books in the library.

Mentor system: Institutionalising the mentoring system was introduced to mentor student progression both in academics and help students deal with issues related to life on campus and also give guidance related to their personal issues.
